1	А	Alerters	All staff that work in settings that come into contact with children and young people, their families /carers, vulnerable adults or adults who may pose a risk to children.	This group has the responsibility to be competent in identifying possible indicators of abuse or neglect and be able take appropriate action to raise a safeguarding concern.	ALL staff and volunteers who are employed by agencies represented by the Wigan Safeguarding Partnership and other agencies that provide care and/or support services.
2	B1	Responders and Specialist Practitioners	All practitioners that have contact with children and young people, their families /carers, vulnerable adults or adults who may pose a risk to children.	In addition to the Level 1 duties this group also has the responsibility to refer Safeguarding concerns through the correct organisational processes.	ALL staff that are in regular direct contact with children and young people, their families /carers, vulnerable adults or adults who may pose a risk to children, and who may need to make a Safeguarding referral.
3	B2	Responders and Specialist Practitioners	Registered professionals working with children and young people, their families /carers, vulnerable adults or adults who may pose a risk to children who contribute in assessing, planning, intervening and /or evaluating need.	In addition to the Level 1 and 2 duties this group also has the responsibility for making decisions for concerns raised. They hold key roles within the safeguarding process.	ALL staff that are in regular direct contact with children and young people, their families /carers, vulnerable adults or adults who may pose a risk to children and who may contribute to a Safeguarding enquiry /assessment of need.
4	С	Decision Makers	Specialist roles and named professionals	In addition to the Level1-3 duties this group is also responsible for ensuring the management and delivery of safeguarding services. They will have oversight of the development systems, policies and procedures in accordance with national, local and organisational policies and procedures.	Staff that have Management roles relating to Safeguarding.
5	D	Governance and Board Roles and CEO Levels	Specialist roles and designated professionals	In addition to the Level 1-4 duties this group is also responsible for strategic leadership and planning of services for children and adults at risk of abuse.	Staff that have Strategic Management roles relating to Safeguarding.
