### Wigan Children's Trust and Safeguarding Children's Board

#### Vision for children and families within the Wigan Borough

- A whole-system approach will be developed for early intervention and prevention services.
- Children, young people and families are listened to and supported to help them reach their full potential.
- The gap in educational achievement and health and wellbeing of the general population and those most vulnerable groups is narrowed.
- All vulnerable children and young people will feel safe and protected and their welfare is promoted.

#### **Defining 'Early Help'**

"Intervening early and as soon as possible to tackle problems emerging for children, young people and their families or with a population at risk of developing problems. Effective intervention may occur at any point in a child or young person's life"

(C4EO expert group / North West Children's Improvement Programme Integrated Early Help Strategy)

#### Wigan Early Help Outcomes

Children and families have every opportunity:

- to feel safe and supported in their homes and communities,
- to raise and achieve their aspirations around employment, education and training,
- to manage their good health and prevent illness,
- to be empowered, self-reliant and decrease their dependency on the public sector.

#### Wigan Early Help Principles

- A single multi agency assessment, planning and review process is provided and delivered in partnership with children, young people and families.
- Children, young people and families are able to make informed choices.
- Families are central to defining and addressing the problems they face and are key partners in the process.
- Service delivery (universal, targeted and specialist) is holistic, coordinated and seamless.
